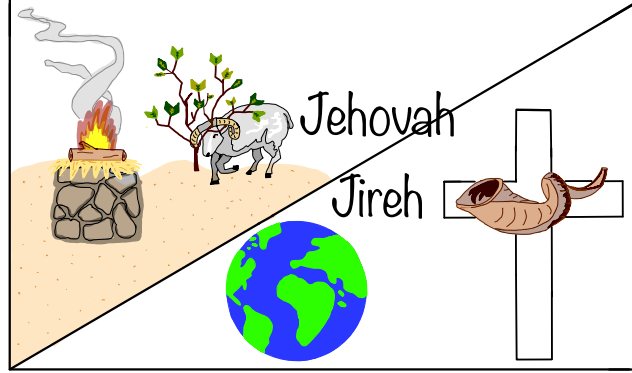

“And He appeared”



Genesis 18: - 22:24

In this week's Parasha God appeared to Abraham to announce Sarah's upcoming conception and birth of the promised son, Isaac. This miraculous birth would take place only after the evil cities of Sodom and Gomorrah were judged by God and completely destroyed with fire and brimstone.

Consistently in this passage of Scripture, Abraham demonstrated belief and trust in God through obedience. He sojourned in Gerar, circumcised his son, Isaac, on the eighth day after birth, sent Hagar and Ishmael away, cut a covenant with Abimelech, and bound his only son, Isaac, for sacrifice to the Lord. Abraham submitted to the will of God even when it did not seem right to him. With each act of submissive obedience, God revealed more of Himself to Abraham with increasingly greater blessings, both physically and spiritually.

~ Focus Passage of Scripture ~
Genesis 22

In Genesis 22:1-2 God gave Abraham a test. This test was not given for God to learn how Abraham thought or felt because God already knew Abraham's mind and heart. This test was an opportunity given by God for Abraham to act according to his mind and heart. This action is called obedience. We can believe in our mind and trust in our heart, but until we act on that belief and trust we have not obeyed. When we act in a way that demonstrates our belief and trust in God, this is obedience to Him. When we obey God, He blesses us according to His perfect will for our lives. A test of obedience from God is not temptation; rather, it is an opportunity to demonstrate to Him and the world that He is our Lord and our God. Abraham's test was to go to the land of Moriah to the one mountain God would choose. There he was to sacrifice his beloved and only son, Isaac, to the Lord.

Genesis 18:1 - 22:24



In Genesis 22:3-4 when God gave Abraham this command, he arose early the next morning, eager to honor God through obedience. He prepared everything necessary to complete the task God had commanded. Abraham took two young men, his son, Isaac, a donkey and the wood for the sacrifice. They arrived at their **moed**/destination/appointment with God on the third day.

In Genesis 22:5-6 Abraham instructed the men to stay with the donkey, while he and his son went to the mountain of God to worship, and then they would return to them. This demonstrated to the men Abraham's belief and trust in God. Notice, the father carried the fire and knife, and the son carried the wood for the sacrifice. Both father and son were united, working together.

In Genesis 22:7-8 Isaac asked his father about the lamb needed for the sacrifice. Abraham explained that God would provide Himself the lamb for the burnt offering. This testimony of Abraham to his son allowed Isaac to trust his father.

In Genesis 22:9-10 Abraham and Isaac arrived at the place of sacrifice. Abraham built an altar, placed the wood in order, bound Isaac and placed him on the altar to be sacrificed. Abraham then took the knife to slay his son. This act of obedience by Abraham and Isaac demonstrated their belief and trust in God. It also demonstrated their unity.

In Genesis 22:11-12 God called Abraham from heaven and told him not to harm his son. God was pleased that Abraham had demonstrated to both heaven and earth by his actions his belief and trust in God. Abraham put God first place in his life! Abraham passed the test!

In Genesis 22:13-14 when God saw Abraham's actions, He immediately responded to Abraham's faithful obedience and provided a substitute for the burnt offering. Abraham found behind him a ram caught by his horns in a thicket. A ram is young male lamb. Abraham offered the ram up as a burnt offering, and he and his son, Isaac, worshipped God together. Abraham named this place of worship, The Lord-Will-Provide. By these things we know today that in the Mount of the Lord He will provide.

In Genesis 22:15-18 we learn that God spoke from heaven to Abraham, once again, declaring these blessings: Abraham's descendants will be ever present and remain where God puts them in multitude, just as the stars in heaven and the sand of the seashore are present and remain; Abraham's descendants will be victorious over their enemies; and all the nations of the earth will be blessed by the seed of Abraham. Because Abraham faithfully obeyed God's commands, He abundantly blessed him, according to His perfect will.

In Genesis 22:19-24 Abraham and Isaac returned to the two young men and donkey as a testimony of God's provision. They traveled together back to Beersheva. As a result of all these things, God drew Abraham closer to Him. He revealed to Abraham that eight sons had been born to his brother Nahor and wife Milcah. To the youngest of these sons was born a daughter named Rivka. Now the Lord had provided Isaac's future wife.

“Out of the Thicket”

Haftorah: 2 Kings 4:1-37

New Testament: 2 Peter 2:4-11

~ Focus Passage of Scripture ~
2 Kings 4:1-37

In this week's Haftorah we learn of five miracles God performed through Elisha the prophet. Let's take a look at one of these miracles to see what we can pull out of the thicket.

Elisha was a descendent of Abraham. He lived in the land God promised to give Abraham's descendants. Elisha was born about 1,200 years after Abraham died. God always keeps His promises (Genesis 22:17). Elisha - just like Abraham - was a Prophet of God. This means God spoke truth to him clearly. Elisha trusted and obeyed God just as Abraham had.

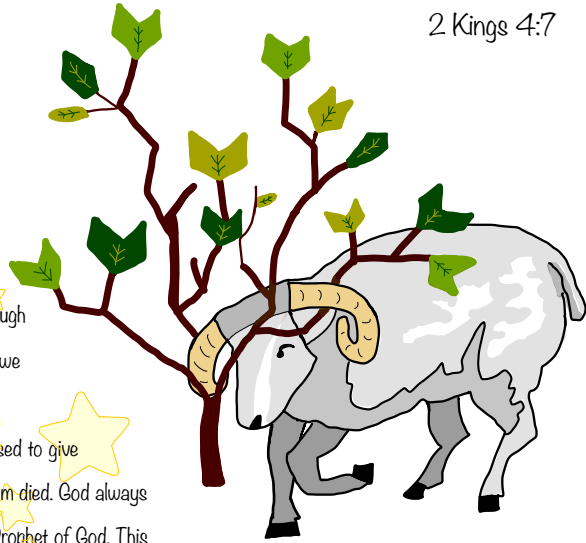
In 2 Kings 4:1-7 we learn of a widow who was in danger of losing her two sons to slavery because of her inability to pay her debt. The only thing of value she had access to was a jar of oil in her home. Elisha told her to borrow empty vessels/containers from all her neighbors everywhere. She obeyed the prophet's command, and the oil in the jar miraculously filled all the empty vessels her sons brought to her. The moment the last empty vessel was filled the oil from the jar stopped flowing. The widow reported these things to Elisha the prophet who instructed her to go, sell the oil, pay her debts, and live on the profit with her sons.

Just as God did not reveal the outcome of blessing to Abraham, who was willing to sacrifice his beloved son, God did not reveal the outcome of abundant blessing given to the widow who relied on the one jar of oil. In both these situations God knew the mind and heart of the individual and presented a test to them. The test was an opportunity to demonstrate obedience to the word of God, even if they did not understand. As a result of obedience, God abundantly blessed them, according to His perfect will for their lives.

In this passage of Scripture the oil represents the Holy Spirit, and the empty vessels, which were filled miraculously by one jar, represents all those who believe, trust, and obey God. The one jar that was able to fill all the empty vessels represents the one God. He gives the Holy Spirit to every empty person brought to Him by His son, Yeshua. This person's debts are then paid in full because of the birth, death, and resurrection of Yeshua, and they have all they need for abundant, eternal life. Think now about these things, and see what you can pull out of the thicket.

Then she came, and told the man of God. And he said,

2 Peter 2:4-11

In this New Testament passage we find a summary of God's salvation for all who believe and trust in Him. Both Noah and Lot were saved from God's judgment of sin, while the ungodly perished and were reserved for eternal condemnation.

God never tempts anyone! It is Satan who tempts everyone, with our own worldly desires of the flesh.

God is able and ready to deliver all believers out of temptation by the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit. As believers, we must be alert and on guard at all times because it is Satan and our connection to him in the flesh that leads us to sin against God.

Let's take a look at these similarities between Noah and Lot:

- Both men were saved because they followed God's instruction for the only way to salvation.
- Both men were saved from God's judgment of sin.
- Both men, having been saved, got drunk.
- Both men were unalert and vulnerable in their drunken state.
- Both men sinned against God in this condition because they were unable to recognize and resist the evil scheme of Satan.

As believers, we must work to know the truth of God's word and remain alert and on guard at all times. In this state when we are tempted in our flesh, we can ask the Holy Spirit to help us. He sees our need and is able and ready at all times to deliver us from any form of temptation. The Holy Spirit always provides a way out for us.
