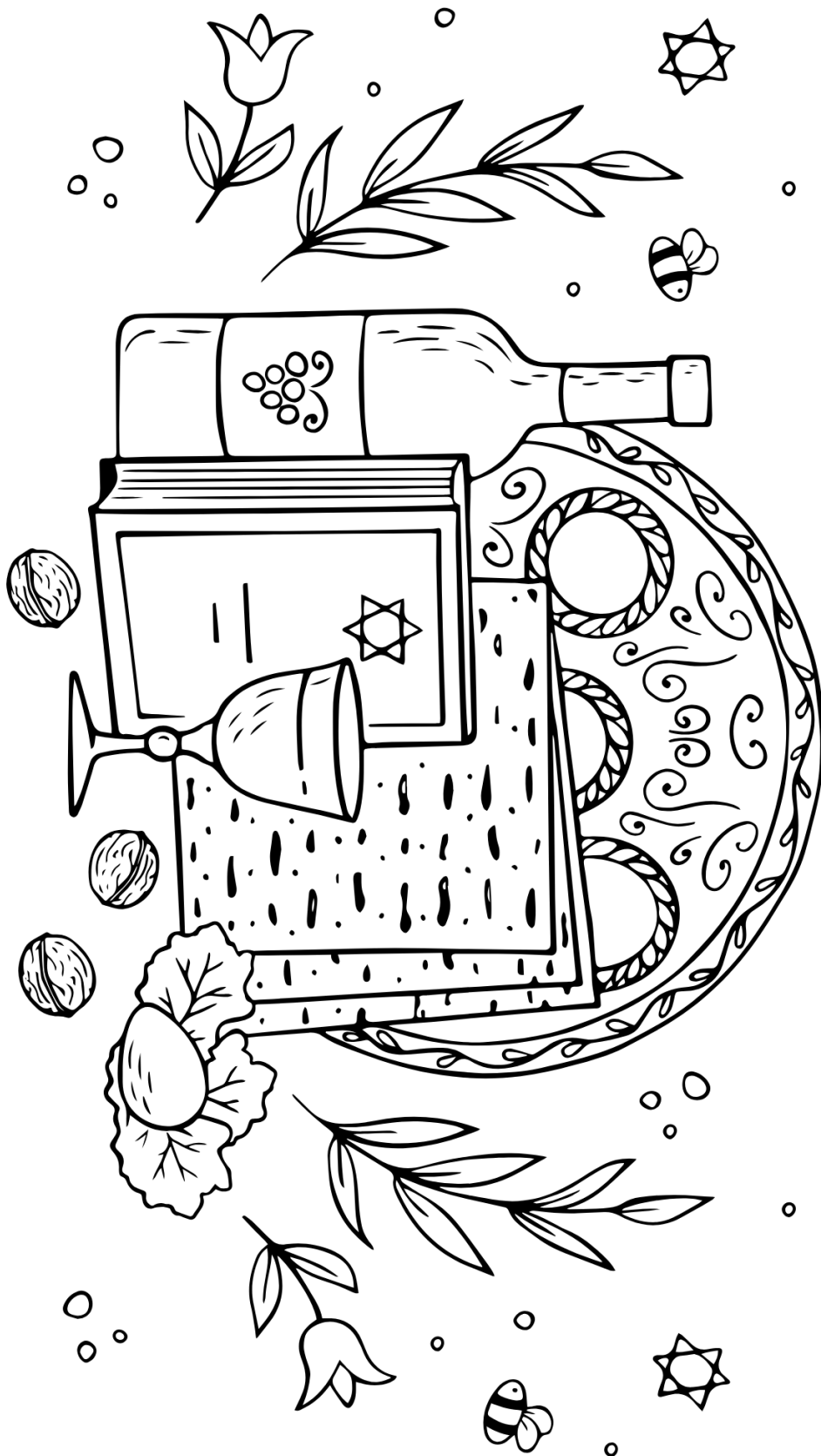

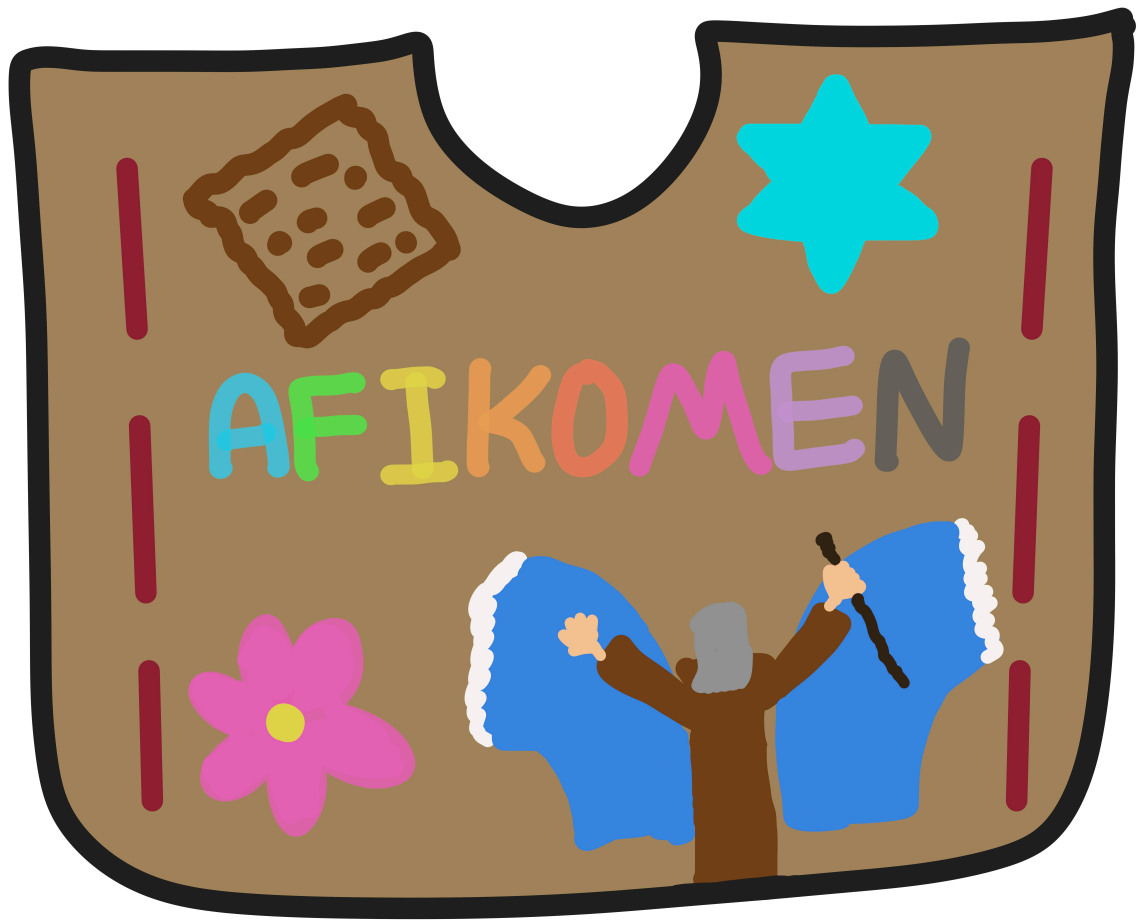

Make an Afikomen Bag!

Matzahs are an important part of Passover traditions. During Passover Matzahs are the main kind of bread that is eaten (there are a couple of other kind of special bread that can be eaten).

It is tradition that the Afikomen is hidden as a symbol of Yeshua being buried and out of site and then on the third day being manifested through the resurrection. It is a game that the Children are go and find the Afikomen. Sometimes prizes are involved :) When the Afikomen is hidden it is usually covered in something, therefore it is fun to make your own Afikomen bag.

Paper Bag:

HERE'S WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

- Paper grocery bag
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- Yarn
- Markers or paint to decorate

HERE'S WHAT YOU DO:

1. Cut along the long edges of the grocery bag and also the bottom edge so that you have a single panel. It should be about 12" wide by 16.5" tall.
2. Fold the panel in half so that it's about 12" wide by 8.25" tall.
3. Mark the spots where you will do your hole punches. Make sure that you have a width for a 7 inch piece of matzah. There will be plenty of room for the afikomen, if you make your holes about a half inch in from each edge.
4. Punch through both layers of the bag along the right and left edges with your hole punch.
5. It's easier to lace the holes if you have a longer piece of yarn, so cut a piece of yarn about 12" to 14" long.
6. Starting on one side of the bag, put your piece of yarn through the lowest hole from the back and out to the front. Heading upward, pull the yarn a bit and put it into the next hole from front to back. Lace the yarn from back to front, and then front to back until you get to the end. Make sure that you have about an equal amount of an extra "tail" at both the beginning and the end.
7. Tie a knot on each end, when you have finished lacing one edge of the bag, and then cut each "tail" close to the knot.
8. On the other edge of the bag, repeat steps 5, 6, and 7.
9. Finally, it is time to decorate your bag! You can use anything you want, such as; markers and paint. You can write different word on the bag that are related to Passover, such as; "Afikomen", "Passover" or "Pesach." You can also draw Passover objects such as; a seder plate, cups of wine, matzah, pyramids and the Haggadah! It is nice to write your name and the year on the back of the bag!
