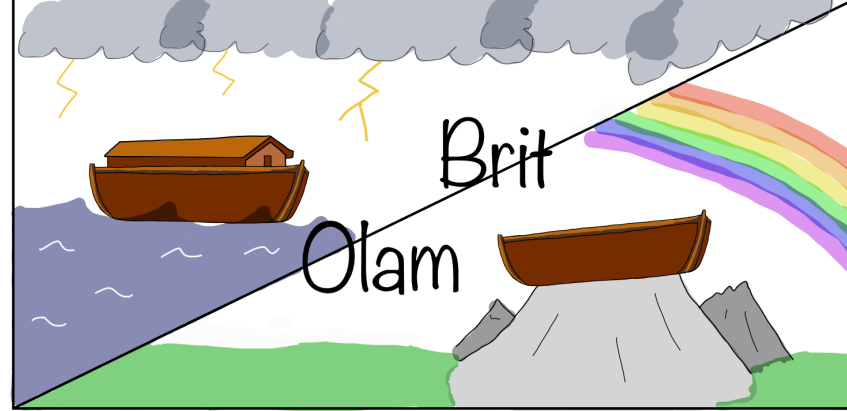


# Noach

Genesis 6:9-11:32

In this week's Parasha we learn that God is comforted by His righteous Judgment of sin. When we accept God's provision to save us from the punishment we deserve, He extends grace in the form of a new covenant.

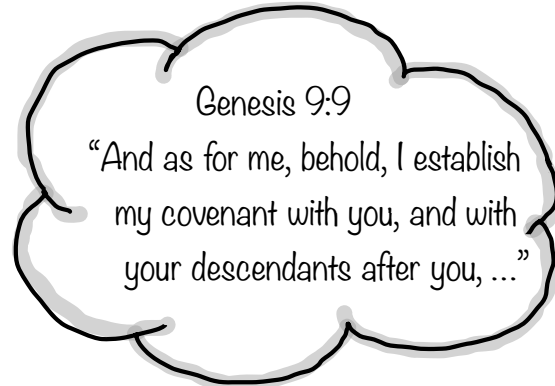
Noach (Noah) and his family were the only humans who did not rebel against God. As a result, they were saved from God's judgment and entered into a new covenant with Him. This covenant is everlasting, meaning it is still enforced today.

After the Flood, the descendants of Noach disobeyed God's command to fill the earth. They stayed in one place and began building a tower to make a name for themselves. This sin brought God's discipline in the form of different languages and dwelling boundaries for all people.

~ Focus Passage of Scripture ~  
Genesis 8:20 - 9:17

The people that lived before the Flood knew how God wanted them to live, but they disobeyed God's plan for their lives. This disobedience led to great hamas (violence) on the earth at all times. This disorder and misuse of God's creation resulted in His judgment.

Did you know that God is a God of order? His order is perfect, so it does not change! Since God's order is perfect, His judgment of disorder is right. God must judge sin because He is righteous. God is comforted when He judges sin. Once sin has received what it deserves, His perfect order can begin again. When God's perfect order is in place, He offers His grace and truth through a new covenant.



Genesis 9:9

“And as for me, behold, I establish my covenant with you, and with your descendants after you, ...”

**Read Next**

Genesis 6:9-11:32

Our focus passage today speaks of Noah and his family, along with many animals who receive God's favor in a wicked generation. Noah spent many years building the ark exactly as God instructed. During this period of time, God was warning the wicked people to stop sinning and return to His order for their lives. The people did not repent, despite God's patient calling, and continued to disobey Him. When we continue to disobey God, we are rebelling against Him and His perfect plan for our lives.

In Genesis 8:20-21 we learn that after God destroyed the earth with water, Noah built an altar to worship God. God was comforted because His judgment of sin had restored His perfect order and provision for his creation.

In Genesis 8:22-9:4 God restated His order for His creation. Once again, He commanded man to be fruitful, to multiply and to fill the earth. God stated that animals could now be eaten as food for man with one exception. The blood of an animal must never be consumed as food because it remains set apart for the purposes of God. God set the blood of the animal apart for man to offer on the altar to make atonement for sin and as a sacrifice to worship God.

In Genesis 9:5-6 we learn that God said if a man or beast killed a man, he is misusing God's purpose for the blood. Therefore God commanded that anyone who murders a man must have his life taken by man.

In Genesis 9:8-17 we learn that God made an eternal covenant or brit olam with every living creature of the earth. Eternal covenant in Hebrew is a brit olam. A covenant of God is an agreement from God that reflects His perfect will and loving promises.

The flood was so effective in accomplishing God's judgment that He promised He would never repeat it. As a reminder of this covenant, God gave a sign in the clouds that He brings over the earth. This sign is the rainbow that we see from time to time in the sky. It is a testament to heaven and Earth that God's order is perfect and His judgments are right. The rainbow is a sign to us that God always keeps His promises. It dishonors God for the rainbow to be used to symbolize anything other than His new eternal covenant with His creation.



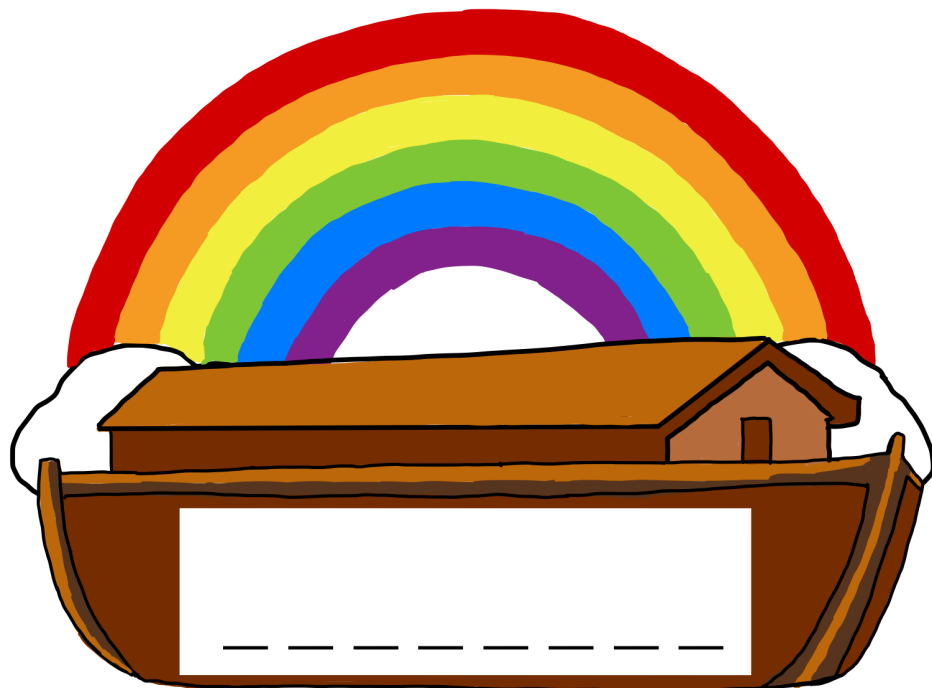
# Recap Review Fun

# A Bird's Eye View

1 Peter 3:18-22

Isaiah 54:1 -55:5

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the Righteous One for the unrighteous, that He might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive by the Spirit.

1 Peter 3:18

~ 1 Peter 3:18-22 ~

In this passage of Scripture we learn that just as God was patient with humanity in the days of Noah, He is patient with humanity today. God does not want one soul to perish, but He must judge sin.

In the days of Noah, there was only one ark with one door to enter. All who ignored this provision from God died in the flood. All who trusted in God's Word entered the ark and survived His judgment. Likewise, there is only one way by which a person can escape God's future judgment of sin. That one way is to trust only in one person. To be saved from God's

upcoming wrath and judgment, a person must trust in the death and resurrection of Yeshua, God's Only Begotten Son. It pleased Father God to place all the sins of the world upon His Son at the Cross for judgement. This does not mean we no longer sin. It means if we trust in the work of Yeshua, we find favor with God, and He declares us righteous in our generation. Trusting in the work of Yeshua will save us from God's future judgment of the world.

Remember the rainbow? God placed it in the clouds as a sign after His first judgment of the world. When He makes it appear today, it is a signal to the world that God remembers and keeps His promises. Likewise, God has given us a sign to demonstrate to Him and to the world that we trust in Yeshua, His Son, for salvation from His future judgment. This sign is called baptism.

## Pray First

Father God,

We praise You for Your provision of salvation and forgiveness of our sins. We acknowledge that Your Way is the Only Way to obtain redemption. And eternal life. Thank You for Your eternal grace and covenant of peace that You freely give to anyone who trusts in the Way, Yeshua. In His blessed Name we pray. Amen.

1 Peter 3:18-22

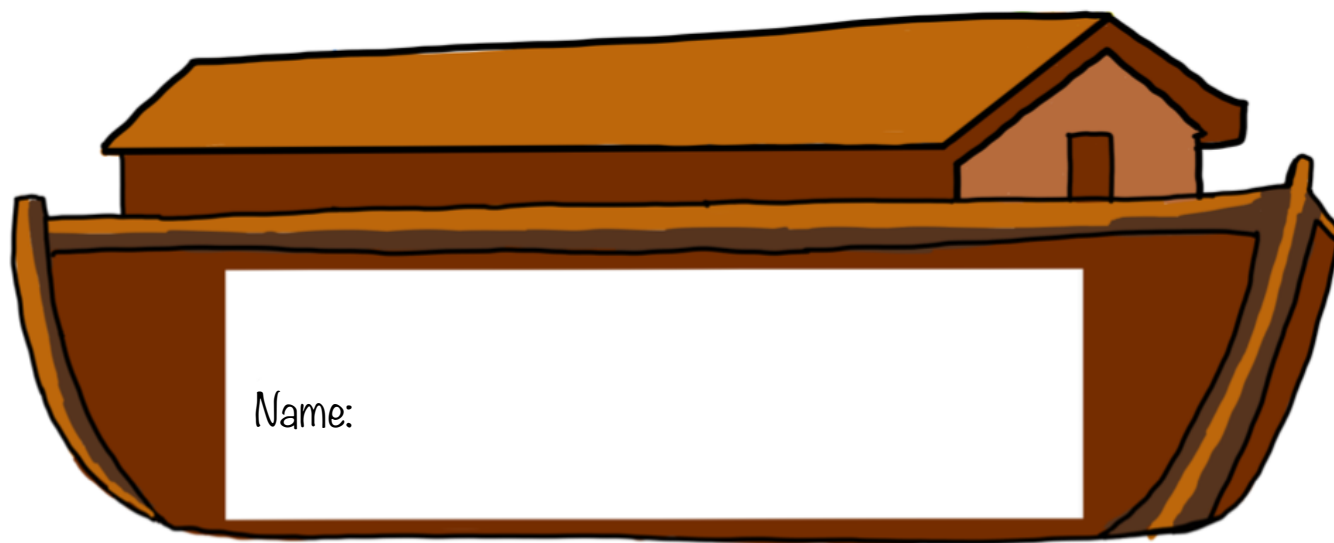
Isaiah 54:1-55:5

When a person is baptized, he is completely immersed in water to represent God's judgment of sin by the flood and by His Son's death and burial in the earth. After being totally underwater, the person is quickly raised out again. This represents the eight people exiting the ark and Yeshua being raised from the grave back to life again. Baptism represents a change in status. God commands each person who trusts in the work of Yeshua for salvation to be baptized as a demonstration of their faith in Him.

Will you trust in Yeshua today? If so, pray this prayer to God right now:

Father God,

I admit that I am a sinner and in need of salvation. Your Son, Yeshua, shed His Blood on the cross as a provision for my salvation and forgiveness of my sins. This was the Way You wanted His Blood to be used. You were pleased with His sacrifice to save me, and You raised Him back to life again. I want to thank You for loving me so much that You asked Yeshua's to do this for me. I want to make Him my LORD and my God because He loved You so much that He was willing to die instead of me. Please now, Father, put the Holy Spirit in me forever. Amen

\* When zeros are added to a number in the Bible, they give the additional meaning of entirety or complete.

The dimensions of the ark, **330L x 50W x 30H**, provided the total area of safety during the flood. The ark provided complete **victory over death**, giving **freedom** to worship God.



The eight people who entered the ark received **redemption** and a **new beginning** on a **renewed** earth.

### Transition or Change

## 17

The flood began on the 17th day of the 2nd month, and the ark rested on the 17th day of the 7th month.

## 15

### The Name of God "Yah"

The waters rose upward to God 15 cubits.

The Flood completely **changed** the earth and **transitioned** it to once again be **completely set apart** to reflect the Character/Name of God.
